

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are proud of our school uniform and encourage the children to feel proud to belong to Ryarsh Primary School. All children will be expected to wear the correct school uniform at all times. We value highly the commitment of parents in ensuring that our children are correctly dressed for school.

Please name all clothing and personal items.

Winter Uniform

Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress

White shirts (not polo shirts). Top buttons are expected to be done up at all times.

Bottle green v-necked pullover or cardigan (*pullovers embroidered with the Ryarsh motif are available from the school office)

*Tie

Grey or white socks or green or grey tights

Flat black shoes (not boots or trainers - shoes should not come above the ankle)

Summer Uniform

Short grey trousers or skirts with white short sleeved open-necked shirt (not polo shirts) or green and white checked dress

Grey or white socks

Flat black shoes (not boots or trainers - shoes should not come above the ankle)

We ensure our children wear protective sun hats, provided by the school, during the summer months.

PE and Sports Kit

*Bottle green shorts

*White T shirts (with Ryarsh motif)

Bottle green jogging bottoms and sweatshirts (*jogging bottoms and sweatshirts with the Ryarsh motif are available from the school office)

All children need plimsolls for PE. In KS2 children must have trainers for outdoor games.

Children are loaned kit when they represent the school for sports tournaments or matches.

Book bags

*Bottle green book bag with the Ryarsh motif

All children in the Foundation Stage and KS1 (Dolphin, Seahorse and Penguin class) must have a Ryarsh book bag, as this makes it easier for staff to ensure that children take contact books, reading books and other information home.

* These items can be purchased from the school office.

For other items, we have no single recommended supplier and shopping around is obviously wise.

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear rings, necklaces, bracelets or looped earrings at school.

Only small, plain studs are to be worn. The school can accept no liability for the loss of any personal property and these items can be a positive source of danger in such lessons as physical education and craft. As most pupils have some physical activity almost every day, earrings will have to be removed frequently. If you are planning to have your child's ears

pierced, please make sure that it is at the beginning of the summer holiday, otherwise ears will have to be taped during Physical Education - including swimming. Staff are not permitted to remove children's earrings, so please make sure that your child is able to do this independently.

Watches may be worn and should be named - we often see two alike.

Nail polish and make-up are not to be worn at any time.

Long hair should be tied back. Only plain hair bands or clips (black, brown, green or white) should be worn.
